Israel Suggests Apology Is Enough For Eichmann

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, July 5 (AP) — Israel has asked Argentina to consider an apology by Foreign Minister Golda Meir, adequate reparation for the assassination, removal of Adolf Eichmann.

An official note from the Jerusalem government to gain Israel's consent that the wartime Nazi general would not be returned to Israel. Arafat Jewish agency spokesman said there is no possibility of extradition to Israel. The man on charge that he played a leading role in the extermination of 6 million European Jews.

The United Nations Security Council resolution June 23 said the seizure of Eichmann violated Argentine sovereignty and recommended that Israel make adequate reparation.

The council did not call for the return of Eichmann as Argentina's first demand. It also urged the concerned states to make arrangements for the peaceful settlement of the dispute. It demanded that Argentina accept the appeal of Mr. Meir's extradition. The council would also consider the matter again. The note also stressed that Eichmann will be held in Israel for trial.

Argentine officials had no immediate comment on the note from Jerusalem.
