SUBJ: Adolf EICHMANN Trial

1. Moshe PEARLMAN's The Capture of Adolf Eichmann (Weidenfeld and Nicolson, London, 1961) appeared on the bookstands one morning last week but by the next day had disappeared. One bookstore owner said that the police had collected all the copies in his store, and had given him a receipt against them.

2. On 24 February [] asked [] about it. He said that it was his understanding that the assistant to EICHMANN's lawyer had objected to the appearance of the book, on the grounds that the case was sub judice. The court had ordered that the books should be collected.

3. [] assumes that there is no problem in obtaining copies abroad. If there is, however, [] has a copy he will be happy to contribute, and [] ~~obviously~~ can obtain more.

4. The Jerusalem Post of 27 February 1961 states that Finance Minister Levi ESHKOL told the cabinet that not a single official body had provided any official material to PEARLMAN for his book.
