MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR OF CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE

Subject: George Folk Murder

1. [redacted] recently in Greece, and now in [redacted] is believed to hold possible clues to the Folk murder. Apparently, according to word just received from [redacted] know of one person in Salonika who might have put Folk in contact with Barkos. Polk's widow told [redacted] on 3 June that [redacted] had planned to accompany Folk if the visit to Barkos could have been arranged.

2. On request from [redacted] authority has been granted [redacted] to proceed to [redacted] on four days temporary duty for the purpose of interviewing [redacted] before he leaves [redacted] This [redacted] who knows [redacted] personally also possesses a detailed knowledge of the Folk case. It is believed that this is a reasonably good opportunity for learning from [redacted] information about the Folk case which is not yet known.
