- 1247 Mr. Kidd (DIA) discussed a paper by Hitchcock and said "it was a fair picture."
- 1435 CAPT Kidd returned a call to Mr. Hitchcock and his end of

 the conversation went something like: "I checked in the

 hall and confirmation is uncertain." "How about that first

 bit of information for ADM Griffin." "Understood."
- Announcement received that Cuban defense minister had reported they had fired on hostile aircraft. One of our U-2's which had been on a low-level reconnaissance flight was overdue for 1 hour.
- 1500 CNO Called ADM Griffin to check on things
- 1525 Afternoon low-level photo mission airborne. (One was also ordered and executed this morning.)
- 1543 ADM Griffin called for CAPT Ward to discuss POLARIS.
- 1547 CAPT Thomas reported that a news release concerning enforcement of surveillance was put out "2 minutes ago" by Mr. Sylvester and delivered a copy to ADM Griffin.
- 1604 2 of the eight U-2's on reconnaissance flight returned

 with engine trouble. CINCLANTFLT reports U-2 still overdue
- 1636 Blue Moon was fired at.
- 1640 Blue Moon all Navy/Marine Corps aircraft. Anti-aircraft fire believed to be 30mm canana.
 - ADM Griffin reviewing U-2 attack incident and contingency plan 312 (SheekBlack) for discriminatory retaliation in the event of shooting at reconnaissance aircraft.
 - 1745 ADM Griffin has requested information on an incident in



which swimmers tried to attach a limpid mine to the hull of a vessel in a Cuban harbor. The swimmers could not get close enough because of a force field. CDR Howshoe, IDO, was told to have intelligence investigate every angle of the incident and determine if phenomenon was due to natural causes or generated by the ship and if generated by the ship how she did it and what kind of a ship is she.

2000 CNO arrived

2055 CNO requested current status of Lexington. Word passed to flag plot

2100 CNO Departed for SECNAV's office

LCDR Ripley reported the status of the Lexington: she was scheduled to leave today at 1300 but has two bad xim ship's service generators. She will sail tomorrow at 0800 even if she has to take yard electricians with her. Ammo aboard. She will function as aCVA.

2138 Much excitement over Grosnyy

2210 General LeMay visited ALM Anderson. NOTE: 14,000 air reservists were called to active duty to man 24 transport squadrons.

2255 CNO left

2310 HSS-2 helicopters ordered grounded which downs all ASW helos aboard the ESSEX. VCNO called for ADM Shoop to discuss the situation.
