
APPEALS PANEL ACTION: RELEASED IN FULL



General Scowcroft/Secretary Kissinger January 30, 1975



S: I am just reading it. Absolutely unbelievable. Somebody has gone back and debriefed that meeting.

K: So it comes back to mee again.

K: But almost every day I am in there crying.

S: Maybe I ought to raise it tomorrow morning at the Intelligence Board?

K: Why don't you do it, seriously. Raise it xxxxxxxxxx tomorrow.

S: I think that is a good idea.

K: Just tell him the erosion is too great.

S: I will do it on both of them.

K: You know what happened at lunch today was characteristic of what happens in this town. The Case reply to Callaghan.



S: What was that?

K: When Callaghan said I was such an asset and they shouldn't. and Case said did he put you up to this. It was half a joke but they didn't want to hear it.

S: I don't know if Case has sense enough to take it seriously. Callaghan was speaking only from his own part.

K: He told me that privately. He told me he was going to say it to the Senate KKOEXX Foreign Relations Committee today and Howard Lever said it too. But if they go through with this Vietnam thing I can't put up with it.

Do you have a new list?

S: I am going to bring it over in a few minutes.

K: Ck.
