The following investigation was conducted by SA [redacted] on 8/30/68:

AT WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS

[redacted], Waxahachie PD, furnished the following information:

On 8/28/68 that department received a telephone complaint from [redacted] Waxahachie, stating that [redacted] stayed at [redacted] for three nights and left owing a \$14.00 telephone bill.

[redacted] assisted by other Waxahachie police officers located [redacted] and associates on the outskirts of Waxahachie. Officers were given voluntary permission to search their vehicles, which were described as [redacted]

[redacted] In the search officers located two Italian Brevettata .22 caliber revolvers bearing serial numbers B4679 and B54400, both Model 999, which fire only blanks. Officers also found a General Electric tape recorder, type 6VDC, Serial No. 201A2483, Model RP 3030A.

[redacted] played a tape recording which was found with the above tape recorder. [redacted] it as a recording of a rally, purpose or place not identified. He recalled statements made by speakers as, "Most of the voting is for whites, but blacks don't have to go to the polls to rule, because we have Black Power, Black Power, Black Power!!" Another speaker stated, "Just the other day [redacted] was overruled, but look at him now - Black Power, Black Power!" [redacted] of the tape was not clear due to background noise and dialect of speakers.

During the search, officers also found bull whips, machettes and literature concerning black power.

[redacted] accompanied [redacted] back to police headquarters. Inquiry by Waxahachie Police with Michigan authorities determined above-described vehicles were not stolen and owners were not wanted. It was reported that [redacted]

[redacted] but [redacted] was in process of being transferred to [redacted]

None of the property found by the police in the search was retained and [redacted] paid the \$14.00 telephone bill, he and his associate were released.

After their departure from Waxahachie, [redacted] received a reply from NCIC that above described tape recorder was reported stolen at Hillsboro, Oregon, no other details furnished.

[redacted] made available photostats of two checks which were cashed by [redacted] at the Citizens National Bank, Waxahachie, Texas, on 8/28/68, after determining that these checks were good. Both checks dated 8/23/68 were drawn on [redacted]

[redacted] signed [redacted] Checks had printed notation, "Reissued For Stolen Check." One check was made payable to [redacted] in the amount of \$60.00. This check was endorsed by [redacted]

The second check was made out to [redacted] for \$70.00 and endorsed by [redacted] same address.

[redacted] advised that no photographs or fingerprints were taken of the two men. They [redacted] that they were en route to Mexico City to attend the Olympics. They said they had the machettes to hack their way through the bushes in Mexico.

[redacted] stated that [redacted] had registered there with a party of six others for two suites totaling \$53.00 per day. No other names were furnished. [redacted] listed his employment [redacted]

[redacted] advised that [redacted] received a Western Union Money Order on 8/26/68, in the amount of \$300 from [redacted]. The money order was actually issued at Waxahachie and was deposited in [redacted] account after being cashed for [redacted]. The sender of the money order was not known.

[redacted] said he had little contact with [redacted] and none with other members of the party. [redacted] that they were going to the Olympics.
