BENEDICT DeBUFF, called as a witness, having first been duly sworn by the Foreman, testified as follows:-

BY MR. SAYPOL:

- Q Mr. DeBuff, what is your occupation? A Federal grand jury stenographer.
- Q In the Southern District of New York? A In the Southern District of New York.
- Q Were you in that same occupation in June and July of 1947? A I was.
- Q In connection with the performance of your official duties did you have occasion to record the testimony of one Abraham Brothman on July 22nd, 1947? A Yes, sir.
- Q I show you a transcript of the testimony of Brothman, commencing on page 849 and continuing to page 877, and inquire whether by refreshing yourself from your original notes you are prepared to tell the jury that you recorded and transcribed that testimony? A That's correct, sir.
- Q Immediately preceding the eliciting of the testimony from Mr. Brothman was an oath administered to him by the foreman of the jury? A It was.
 - Q Did Mr. Brothman take the oath? A He did, sir.
 MR. SAYPOL: That is all.
