### Scope & Content:

This collection contains declassified documents of the United States Central Intelligence Agency related to the Vietnam War, Vietnam, and Southeast Asia. They date from 1959 to 1987 (bulk 1962-1973). They contain situation reports of South Vietnam and Laos, (some monthly, others weekly); intelligence reports on North Vietnam or on special topics such as air capability; memoranda and other communications regarding POW sightings and identification; and miscellaneous reports on other topics. Some of the documents have been "sanitized."
