SUBJECT: Request for Information

This memo presents in written form the request for information that we discussed on the telephone yesterday. As always, CRS is responding to a congressional request.

We request any information on any funds being held to compensate cither or both of two federally-recognized California tribes,

the Painte-Shoshone Indians of the Lone Pine Community of the Lone Pine Reservation, and

the Painte-Shoshone Indians of the Bishop Community of the Bishop Colony,

for past wrongs against them. The two tribes are part of the Owens Valley Paiute, which is a larger geographic grouping of Northeln Paintes (but which is not, as a whole, a separate federally-recognized tribe).

The Owens Valley Painte have redeived at least one federal award for past wrongs. Certain Northern Paints—the 'Monos of Paintes of Owens Velley"—won a 1965 Indian Claims Commission judgment (Docket 87, affirmed 1968) of \$935,000 in compensation for lands (see U.S. Indian Claims Commission, Final Report, H.Doc, 96-383, 96th Cong., 2d sess., 1978, p. 66; copy attached). The Lone Pine and Bishop tribes, or the Owens Valley Paints, may also have received other federal funds for past wrongs. The ICC award (and, possibly, other awards) may have already have been distributed, or they may still be included in funds managed by the Office of Trust Funds Management. The congressional requester is seeking any information that OTFM may have about such funds.

I am well aware that OTFM has limitations on whatiinformation it may release about funds under its management. I am requesting only information that does not violate privacy or other restrictions on trust fund information.
