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## Authorization for FORED Use of Troless Manage

You will recall that the signature of the pro-- posed agreement on this subject (copy attached), which was approved by Cabinet on March 23, 1965, has been held in sheyance pending an understanding between yourself and President Johnson concerning the capleyment of unclear weapons in the event of a surprise attack in which prior consultation between CINCRORAD and the two Governments is not practicable. Throughout the associations it has been recognized that an arrangement to cover this situation is needed, but because of the political sensitivity of any apparent delegation to military commanders of the power of decision in this matter it was considered inappropriate to try to deal with it explicitly in the agreement itself. Thus the agreement merely states (in paregraph 8(b)) that to provide for such emergency cirownstances you and the President, acting on behalf of your respective Covernments, "will provide for the timely authorisation to CIRCHORAD to employ operationally meleer arms forces."

We have been aware that the President, either officially or on a personal and informal basis, had some time ago made an arrangement for prior authorization, to apply in emergencies, to major U.S. commenders including Clackonad in his purely national capacity as chief of the J.L. Continental Air Defence Command (CINCOMAD). The intention has been that a comparable arrangement, taking account of Canadian constitutional eirquestances, would be cade by yourself with regard to CINCHORAD, and that the President's arrangement would be recast to apply to CINCHORAD rather than CIRCARAD. A prerequisite has been

handed to our Embassy in Mashington the attached text of

controversy during the last J.S. election concerning delegation of authority to use nuclear veapons) appears to provide a clear, precise and satisfactory arrangement for dealing with the United States aspect of the Entter. As you are aware, in negotiating the agreement we have adhered firmly, in the face of some initial U.S. reluctance, to the point that MORAD is a joint command of which the activities in both the U.S. and Canada are equally subject to the joint direction of the two Governments. In these circumstances it clearly behoeves us to come forward promptly with an equally clear-cut arrangement, conforming as closely as possible with the U.S. one, and to oraclude the agreement so as to bring these arrangements into effect.

Mr. Hellyer, who has agreed to the text of this memorandum, joins me in recommending that you approve for transmission to CIECTORAD the proposed form of "timely authorization", and that you sign the attnohed telegram to washington. We have received confirmation from the State Department that the completion of these arrangements in this way, when brought into effect by signature of the agreement, will dispose of the matter of "timely authorization" and obviate any need for a discussion of it between the President and yourself.

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
