MEMORANDUM FOR MR. HARRISON:

The notes of the June 21 meeting of the Interim Committee indicate the following action to be taken:

- 1. Inform the Secretary of War
 - That, at the discretion of the Secretary of
 War, he should inform the President that the
 Interim Committee had agreed that, in the
 coming Conference and if suitable opportunity
 arose, the President might mention, subject
 to the agreement of the Prime Minister, that
 this country is working in this field, that
 if results are satisfactory we might use the
 weapon against Japan, that no further information can be given at this time but that it
 is the President's hope that the weapon might
 become an aid to peace and that this aspect of
 the subject might be discussed further at a
 later date.

- (b) That the Committee voted unanimously that
 the Secretary of War be advised that the
 Interim Committee favored revocation of Clause
 Two of the Quebec Agreement (secondly, that
 we will not use it against third parties without each other's consent) by appropriate action.
- (c) That the Committee reaffirmed the position taken at the May 31 and June 1 meetings that the weapon should be used against Japan at the earliest opportunity, that it be used without warning, and that it be used on a dual target, namely, a military installation or war plant surrounded by or adjacent to homes or other buildings most susceptible to damage.
- (d) That the Committee approved the recommendation of the Scientific Panel that the directive to the Manhattan District be extended to include work of post-war importance, such work not to exceed an annual budget of \$20,000,000.
- Appoint a sub-committee to rework the publicity statements, the members of the sub-committee to be Mr. Page
 and a representative from General Groves' office.
