This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act.

I request a complete and thorough search of all filing systems and locations for all records and correspondence maintained by your agency pertaining to the possibility of John Syphrit offering testimony to Congress regarding the POW/MIA issue (for your information, there has been recent controversy about Mr. Syphrit, an employee of the Treasury Department, testifying before the Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs). My request includes all correspondence between your agency and all other individuals or branches of the government, as well as internal memos discussing matters relating to the testimony of Mr. Syphrit. This request also specifically includes "main" files and all related material, including, but not limited to, unfiled material and "see references." I request that all records be produced with the administrative and cover pages.

I believe my request qualifies for a waiver of fees since the release of the requested information would primarily benefit the general public and be "in the public interest."

I expect a response to this request within ten (10) working days, as provided for in the Freedom of Information Act.
