## SITEEP COVERING PERIOD 010600B MAY TO 020600B MAY 94.

- 1. GEN SITUATION. THE FIRST HALF OF THE DAY WAS CALM. HOWEVER HOSTILITIES RESUMED AROUND NOON AND CONTINUED INTO BARLY EVENING ARCUND THE CITY CENTRE. FIGHTING WAS ALSO REPORTED IN THE NORTH AROUND RUHENGERI. TRAM FROM FORCE HQ VISITED CRASH SITE NEAR KANONBE CAMP FOR THE FIRST TIME. VERBAL AGREEMENT GRANTED FOR INVERSTIGATIONS TO COMMENCE ON REQUEST. RECRUITMENT OF YOUNG MEN STILL IN PROGRESS. RPF SHELLED AREA ARCUND SAINTE FAMILLE REFUGEES. CAMP RESULTING IN DEATH AND INJURY TO SOME OF THE REFUGEES. DISCUSSIONS HELD WITH RGF COS AND INTERHAMWE LEADERS. MILITIA SEEMS TO BE TONING DOWN. RESTRICTIONS FROM BOTH SIDES ON MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL HINDERING HUMANITARIAN REFORTS AND LIAISON. SIX MEMBER THAM OF CONTRACTORS INSPECTED SEWRAGE AND WATER SYSTEM AT FORCE HO.
- 2. <u>FOLITICAL ACTIVITIES</u>. STALEMATE CONTINUES. EFFORTS IN PROGRESS TO BRIDGE COMM GAP BETWEEN RGF HIGH COMMAND AND INTERIM GOVT IN GITARAMA.
- 3. PACTIONAL ACTIVITIES. THERE IS NO SIGN OF ANY BREAK IN THE DEADLOCK IN THE FIGHTING. BOTH SIDES REMAIN BELIGERENT.
  - A. RPF. REFORTED TO BE FIGHTING AROUND NKUMBA (NORTH EAST OF RUHENGERI). TROOPS OBSERVED AROUND BUGESERA ABOUT 30 KMs SOUTH OF KIGALI MOVING WEST. EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RGF AROUND CAMP KANONBE, MAGREMA AND GEN STROES AREARS IN KIGALI. FIGHTING WAS ALSO REPORTED AROUND KIMIHIRURA CAMP. 6 X MORTAR ECMES DROPPED AROUND ST FAMILLE REFUGES CAMP KILLING 12 AND WOUNDING OVER 100.0BSERVED MOVING WAR MATERIAL IN NORTH AND NORTHWEST OF COUNTRY. INCREASE IN NUMBER OF TROOPS NOTICED IN AND AROUND BYUMBA. REPORTED TO BE CONDUCTING RECRUITMENT AROUND NIGHRAMA.
  - B. <u>RGF.</u> STILL OFFERING RESISTANCE AROUND RUHENGERI. OBSERVED DIGGING IN AND CONSOLIDATING IN AREA AROUND KIA. EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RPF IN THE CITY. RECRUITMENT OF YOUNG MEN STILL CONTINUING. IT IS SUSPECTED RECRUITS ARE SENT TO GITARAMA POR TRAINING. CONCEEDING TO CRITICAL LOG PROBLEMS. MORALE ALSO SEEMS TO BE DROPPING DUE TO THE LACK OF DIRECTION AND LEADERSHIP. TROOPS IN GITARAMA INTOLERANT TO MILOB TEAM SENT TO BSTABLISH CONTACT WITH GOVT. INCREASE IN NUMBER OF TROOPS ALSO OBSERVED IN GITARAMA.
  - C. <u>MILITIA.</u> STILL CONTROLLING SOME PARTS OF THE CITY TO THE WEST AND MANNING ROAD BLOCKS. MEETING BETWEEN FC AND LEADERS SHOWED POSITIVE SIGNS.
- 4. ONE MILITARY ACTIVITIES NORMAL ROUTINE, ESCORTS AND HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. LIAISON WAS ALSO CONDUCTED WITH ALL PACTIONS DURING THE PERIOD.

A. FORCE BO. FC'S BRIEFINGS HELD AT 010700 AND 012000 RESPECTIVELY. IMPROVEMENT OF DEFENSES ETILL IN PROFRESS. FC HELD SERIES OF DISCUSSIONS WITH PRESIDENT OF INTERHAMME, COS RGF AND THE LEADERS OF SOME POLITICAL PARTIES. GROUP EXPRESSED THE DESIRE FOR THE CONTINUED STAY OF UNAMIR TO ASSIST SOLVE THE PROBLEM. THEY PLEDGED MORE COOPERATION WITH UNAMIR ESPECIALLY IN THE AREA OF HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE. MORE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WERE COORDINATED FROM THIE HQ.
