## **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

Colonel Edward J. Boyle distinguished himself by outstanding achievement as Operations Officer, Expeditionary Air Intelligence Squadron, Air Combat Command at a classified location. During this period, Colonel Boyle's outstanding leadership was critical to extremely sensitive operations under the direct supervision of the National Security Council. As the visionary and senior United States Air Force leader, he directed the unit stand up, from ground zero to fully operational in less than two weeks. After 11 September 2001, his tireless efforts enabled his unit to be the first airborne asset on scene in Afghanistan for Operation ENDURING FREEDOM. He was instrumental in historic MQ-1B Predator deeds, including first ever armed operations, first split operations remotely controlling aircraft 6,000 miles away, and first signals intelligence capability. Commanding an elite team, handpicked from across the Department of Defense, he undertook a revolution in warfare, supporting the most challenging Unmanned Aerial Vehicle operation to date with over 220 missions and 3,600 combat hours. During Operation ANACONDA, he provided unprecedented forward air controller support for multiple platforms until a downed aircrew was rescued. The singularly distinctive accomplishments of Colonel Boyle reflect great credit upon himself and the United States Air Force.
