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PROCUREMENT AND SECURITY PROVISIONS FOR THE R-12 PROGRAM

Responsibilities.

his staff will be located to be to be the staff of the staff System Program Office, located at Wright-Patterson Air Force Ease will perform the functions of the System Program Office for the 1-12 Reconnaissance System. The Chief of the Advanced 3-36(5) Plans and Programs Group, ASD (AF-12-570) is designated as the A(b)(3) Director. The necessary authority is delegated to the Program Director and the System Program Office to carry on the 56, 425 specialized procedures that are now established for the acquisition of the 1-12 and AF-12. The Program Director is responsible for necessary coordination on program interface, procurement, and accuraty matters with the CIA. He is also responsible to heu, the Secretary of the Air Force, Chief of Staff, USAF, and Commander, 4750 advised of program progress on a continuing basid. The System Program Office at Wright-Patterson AFB will be with a minimum number of personnel and will continue the contractor relationships now in operation.


Security.

The security procedures to be followed are as established under NEO Security Policy of 20 November 1962, i.e., the Program Director is delegated "must know" determination authority with clearability vested in the Special Security Center (SSC) of the CIA. Communication controls will be in accordance with procedures and/or suitable controls in accordance with NRO procedures. Facility clearances, access to contractors, etc. will be in accordance with procedures now in use for the OXCART/ WEDLOCK Programs. Due to the close interrelationship between the R-12 System and the current OXCART production effort, CHCART contractors will be utilized where appropriate and duplicate and redundant security procedures will not be establisted. Lirect security coordination between the [Program B and Program D Directors will be established, and plans will be coordinated with the CIA.

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Financial and Contracting.
