Base course 037 T, base speed 8 knots, while tracking and keeping station on a surfaced Russian submarine (Fennant # 945). Submarine bears 000 T, range 3000-3500 yards. A Russian ATR(PANIR) is accompanying the Russian submarine. Maneuvering on various courses at various speeds to maintain station and to remain at least 1800 yards from the ATR.
